Description	<p>Several factors result in excellent dissemination of the project achievements:</p> <p>1) Project web site for popularization of new interdisciplinary model of architect-restorers practical-oriented education for Architectural Heritage in line with best EU practices to increase awareness and response to economic and environmental changes. The portal will be divided into sections, which will be filled as the project runs: information on the project, information on partners; the courses developed under the project, results of teaching of various target groups; events; information sources and services.</p> <p>2) Student 'info-days' will be organized by each of the partner universities (P4 –P11) during the final project year. Info-days will take place in each NSAH centre with active involvement of regional enterprises. The Info-days will also be attended by representatives from P12, thus demonstrating the benefits of the project for the business sector. The students' projects results will be presented at these info-days. Such events will promote, not only dissemination of information on the project, but also for sustainable development of NSAH upon the project completion.</p> <p>3) A final international conference will be carried out in Kazan (P5) with participation of all the organizations - consortium members, as well as experts of industrial enterprises. An important factor will be the involvement of students (members of international teams) as the conference speakers and attendees. Students will present reports on their project evaluations. Heads of the NSAH Centres will present on the Conference business plans of the Centres' sustainable development after the project deadline and discuss it with the associated partners.</p> <p>4) A special role in the assessment of the impact of the project and in dissemination of information about new BSc and MSc programs belongs to P12. A widespread network of associate practical architects will improve the distribution, dissemination and exploitation of the project results. P12 will bring attention to the project within its members and make an effective use of new acquired teaching methodologies and modules.</p> <p>5) Development of a business plan for sustainable functioning by Centres'</p>	

	<p>staff and involved students. Presentation and discussion of elaborated plans on the special seminars at each of the NSAH centres (P4 – P11). Evaluation and comparison of plans by IMQCT and EQCT and associated participants. Development and finalization of common business plan of suitable progress of the NSAH centres. A deep interaction among researchers and experts from different countries (consortium members) will create a model of a Living Lab for innovation and technology/knowledge transfer through the NSAH centres. Traditional Living Lab for Sustainable Architectural Heritage provides start-up services, mentoring and, sometimes, financing, in a physical venue. These factors lead to the more sustainable development of the NSAH centres in each region after the project completes, as a legacy.</p> <p>6) Preparation of information and promotional materials on the results of the project and dissemination through associated partners. The project will also contribute to teachers' publishing activity, as it enables improved awareness about the new courses and methods of their teaching. The project results will be also published in hard copies (printed version) and disseminated among stakeholders.</p>
